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Enrollment and Registration Policies

- Registration is on a first come, first served basis.
- Wait lists are available for each class. Families will be notified if space becomes available.
- Non-refundable registration fee of \$50 per student.
- Students must be enrolled in consecutive courses if they are to remain on campus. No exceptions.
- Students enroll in courses for the grade they will enter in the Fall of 2018.
- All schedule changes incur a \$35 change fee once online registration is completed. No refunds or credits are given if the new course is less than the original choice.
- Friday, June 1, 2018 is the final day to withdraw. Students who withdraw by this date are eligible for a refund of their tuition less the non-refundable registration fee and a \$100 cancellation fee.
- On May 1, under enrolled classes may be cancelled. Families will be notified if cancelled classes affect their registration.
- Marlborough Summer School accepts Visa, MasterCard, American Express, and Discover. No other forms of payment will be accepted.
- Families may elect to pay the entire balance at the time of registration or pay 50% at the time of registration, with the remaining 50% due by June 1, 2018.

Choosing a Class – Kindergarten and First Grade

Marlborough Summer School has a variety of classes available for students entering Kindergarten and First Grade in the fall. We are excited to provide parents and students with age appropriate activities and experiences. Parents may elect for students to participate only in morning classes or may add afternoon activities. Kindergarten and First Grade students will be closely supervised at all times, including lunch time. Please note only students enrolled in an afternoon class may stay for lunch.

During the Five Week Program, Kindergarten and First Grade students enroll in Camp Mustang in the Morning. Camp Mustang in the Morning is from 8:15 a.m. to 12:15 p.m. Tuition for Camp Mustang is for the entire morning through the five weeks. We value the opportunity for all students to meet new people as they enjoy our program and begin their introduction to Kindergarten or First Grade. Therefore, we do not accept requests for students to be placed together in the same group. No exceptions.

Students will be placed in groups prior to the beginning of the Five Week Session and a letter emailed home.

Camp Mustang in the Morning is a combination of our best course offerings and includes an introduction to words and numbers they will see in the fall. The program also gives students the opportunity to create art, dance, sing, and learn gymnastics and science. It is an age appropriate taste of all that Marlborough Summer School has to offer. Parents may also select Camp Mustang in the Morning with Swim Lessons. Limited enrollment is available.

Camp Mustang in the Afternoon is open to Kindergarten and First Grade students who would like to remain beyond 12:15 pm. Students enrolled in Camp Mustang in the Afternoon are provided lunch with their counselors and are then escorted to their afternoon classes. Parents are able to select two classes for their children to participate in during this special afternoon session. To learn more, please see the Camp Mustang in the Afternoon description.

Choosing a Schedule – Grades 2 and Up

Students in Grades 2 and above may choose from over 175 different classes during the Five Week program. Classes for Grades 2 and above offer more flexibility for start and end times. Classes may be chosen starting

during the 8 a.m. hour and continue until 5 p.m. Students may opt to stay only for the morning sessions or may even come only for the afternoon. Students must be enrolled in consecutive classes to stay on campus.

Lunch

Students enrolled in Afternoon Classes automatically receive lunch as part of their enrollment package. Lunch is served buffet style in the East Atrium from 12:25 p.m. to 1:15 p.m. Each day of the week has a different theme, but also includes choice of cheese pizza, fresh salad bar, and sandwich wraps. All meals are prepared on site by Café M and are made based on nutritionist guidelines.

We cannot accommodate special meal requests. If your child has a food allergy, we recommend sending food from home. Please note that students enrolled in afternoon Private Lessons must purchase lunch if they wish to stay in the afternoon. Students will receive a lunch ticket which they will take to the East Atrium to receive their lunches. Camp Mustang students will eat lunch family style in their lunch area.

How to Enroll

Enrollment for Marlborough Summer School takes place online at www.marlboroughsummerschool.org. Parents must create an account and complete the registration online. No registrations may be completed in person. Payment is due at the time of registration and may be made by Visa, MasterCard, American Express, or Discover only. We cannot accept any other form of payment.

Following registration, all communications from the School will be sent via email from Ida Dahan, ida.dahan@marlborough.org. Please be certain to read all communications carefully. Changes to your child's schedule may only be made by contacting Ida Dahan in the Summer School Office. Parents **CANNOT** make changes online.

Wait Lists

If your first-choice class is full, we recommend that you register for your second-choice class. Students are added to the wait list on a first-come, first-served basis. **Families will be contacted if a space becomes available.** There are no guarantees that spaces will come available and we cannot predict if a spot will open.

Frequently Asked Questions About Marlborough Summer School

1) Is Marlborough a summer camp or a school?

Marlborough Summer School is a five-week summer school. We are not a camp. We are so much more! We offer enrichment classes for students to explore their passions and develop their minds, bodies, and imaginations. Our classes are five weeks in duration.

2) Can I sign up by the week?

No, our only week-long classes are our Leadership Workshop for Girls (grades 6-8) and our three Sports Camps (volleyball, basketball and lacrosse). If you are interested in enrolling for any of our other courses, you must enroll for the full five weeks of June 25-July 27. If a student needs to miss days of school, that is fine, but we do not pro-rate for absence.

3) When I am selecting classes, do I pick classes for my child's current grade or the grade in the Fall?

Our classes are designed for students' grades in the Fall. Please make certain to select the correct grade. The system will not allow you to view a class unless it is for the grade you enter.

4) My child and her friends all want to take the same class. Can I ensure they all get in to the same class?

Enrollment is first come, first served. It is possible that some parents will be able to register for a class and others will not. If you are informed that the class you want is full, your best option is to register for the wait list. If a spot opens, we will contact you at that time.

5) How much does Summer School cost?

Your cost will vary depending on the classes and number of classes you select. All prices are included in this catalog.

6) Do you offer financial aid?

Unfortunately, we do not offer financial aid to the public. Current and incoming Marlborough students already

receiving financial support may qualify for financial aid toward academic classes with permission from their Division Director. Parents of current or incoming Marlborough students should reach out to the appropriate Division Director prior to registering for Summer School.

7) What if I need to withdraw my child?

The last date to withdraw and receive a refund is June 1, 2018. After that date, you may withdraw, but there are no refunds. No exceptions. Families who withdraw by June 1 will receive their paid tuition, less the \$50 non-refundable registration fee and a \$100 cancellation fee.

8) My child has changed his/her mind and would like to change a class. Can I do that myself?

No. Once you complete your online registration, only we can make schedule changes on your behalf. You may call or write and we will make the change for you. Please note that there is a \$35 schedule change fee each time you make a schedule change. In addition, you will be responsible for any additional tuition.

9) Can I register for a few classes and add more later?

Absolutely. Register for the classes you know are important to you and contact us when you are ready to add more. We will take care of the rest!

10) Do you offer Extended Care?

Marlborough offers before and after school care for a fee. Parents may elect to enroll in Extended Care which allows them to drop off their child as early as 7:00 a.m. and pick up as late as 5:00 p.m. Parents who need early morning care, but not after school care, may elect to enroll in Before School Care only. Please note that Marlborough allows drop in extended care up to five days with a \$25 fee per day. After five uses, the child will automatically be enrolled in Extended Care for the remainder of the summer.

Emergency Preparedness and Water Safety

Marlborough Students Only

Marlborough Summer School offers the opportunity for students entering grades 9–12 to complete the Emergency Preparedness and Water Safety course requirement in a three week, 60-hour course. The course is offered **June 4–22** from 3:00 – 7:00 p.m.

This required course fulfills one of the Marlborough School graduation requirements. Through this course, students learn to care for others in emergency situations while learning about their personal safety in diverse emergency medical situations. The main components of the course include: First Aid, CPR, and Water Safety. Students will participate in scenarios, practical skill testing and simulated rescue drills, and generally train to be well equipped to handle unexpected emergency events. Students will also develop team leadership skills by using strong collaborative and communication skills during class exercises.

To pass the class, students must fulfill the requirements to earn the following American Red Cross certifications: CPR for the Professional Rescuer, Basic Water Rescue, Emergency Medical Response (including Advanced First Aid, Preventing Disease Transmission, the Detection of Hazardous Materials and Blood-Borne Pathogens and Search and Rescue), Incident Commands, Oxygen Administration, and Multiple-Casualty Incidents.

In addition, for those who wish, there will be an opportunity to earn the American Red Cross Lifeguard Training certification, but this is not required to pass the class. Due to the condensed nature of this course, attendance is mandatory on all dates. Students must also attend and participate in the final simulated skills test and drill that occur during the last week. The simulated test and drill is mandatory for course credit - no exceptions. **Again, students must participate in all 60 hours in order to receive the semester credit for Physical**

Education and fulfill the Marlborough graduation requirement.

Priority registration is given to rising seniors beginning March 1, 2018 at 12:00 p.m. Registration opens for all other students in rising grades 9–12 on March 8, 2018 at 9:00 a.m. Enrollment is limited to 40 students.

Attendance for this course (PLEASE NOTE):

Due to the condensed nature of this course, attendance is mandatory on all dates. Students **MUST** attend and participate in the final simulated skills test and drill that occur in class during the last week. This is **MANDATORY** for course credit - **THERE ARE NO EXCEPTIONS.** If a student cannot commit to attending class Monday through Friday, June 4–22, from 3:00 – 7:00 p.m., she should not register. Students must participate in all 60 hours of the class in order to receive the semester credit for Physical Education and fulfill the Marlborough graduation requirement.

Leadership Week for Girls

Session Dates: June 11-15 and June 18-22

Grades 6-8

Leadership Week at Marlborough aims to give young women skills and confidence both inside and outside the classroom, empowering the next generation of leaders. Rising 6th through 8th graders will participate in mental, physical, and artistic activities while finding opportunities to take on leadership roles with their peers. On a typical day in the leadership week, students can expect to do some of the following: put on goggles to learn carpentry skills in the wood shop; perform improv comedy with her peers without a script; create paintings on a theme or idea of her invention; push herself to try a difficult rock-climbing course; present a speech to practice her public speaking skills; and develop verbal skills to set boundaries in self-defense. Participants will be visiting Rockreation for a special rock-climbing opportunity. The Leadership Workshop is devoted to creating more opportunities for young women to find their voice -- and have fun along the way! Choose from two sessions: June 11-15 or June 18-22. Limited to 20 participants per session.

Camp Mustang in the Morning is a special 4-hour morning program for children entering Kindergarten or first grade in Fall 2018. Camp Mustang participants are arranged in groups with other children entering the same grade and enjoy a variety of activities throughout the day. Each group, led by a Camp Mustang counselor, rotates through the following activities during the five weeks of the program: Stories, Words, and Numbers; Drama; Movement; Art; Music; Science; and Sports Activities. The Stories, Words, and Numbers component of our program is a sneak peek of the coming school year. There is NO homework for Camp Mustang. Children are placed in groups of no more than 12, with two counselors/teachers' aides per group. Each group stays together during the day and throughout the five-week program. In order to offer individual instruction and attention, we can only accommodate a maximum of 90 children on a first-come, first-served basis. Camp Mustang in the Morning concludes at 12:15 p.m. Parents who would like their children to participate in afternoon programs should sign up for Camp Mustang in the Afternoon and, if needed, After-School Care from 2:45 p.m. - 5:00 p.m. Children participating in afternoon programs will have lunch with their group (included in the price). Students who are not enrolled in afternoon programs must be picked up at the Front Gate at 12:15 p.m. All parents are invited to attend the Camp Mustang Performance during the last week of Summer School. The performance will showcase the skills learned throughout the session. Please note: **we do**

not accept requests to pair students in groups. Groups are created so that everyone has a chance to meet new friends. Groups will be assigned in June.

Camp Mustang in the Afternoon is a special afternoon program for Camp Mustang students who would like to choose from a variety of fun classes. Students will be able to attend two 45-minute classes each day from 1:15 pm to 2:45 pm. **Choose two options** to customize your child's afternoon experience while continuing the individual instruction and attention that is a priority of the Camp Mustang program. Enrollment in Camp Mustang in the Afternoon includes lunch each day!

Art Adventures Art is fun! Join us as we learn about famous artists such as Georgia O' Keefe, Henri Matisse, and Andy Warhol, and make wonderful creations each week using a wide variety of artist's materials and themes. Come join the adventure!

Cute & Cuddly Animals Cute and Cuddly Animals is a hands-on experience with some of the most adorable animals around! Kids will enjoy learning about new animals each week from guinea pigs, to ferrets, to miniature chickens, to bunny rabbits, and more! This exciting and enchanting class is perfectly suitable for students of all ages!

Fairy Tales! Students will use beautiful, colorful and fun materials – folding, cutting, tearing, threading, gluing, drawing, stamping, collaging, and more to create enchanting books large and small. Students will learn a variety of book structures, including accordion, envelope, signature, and side bound books. Then they will let their imaginations take flight as they fill their books with letters, words, stories, wishes, images, fun characters, and anything they can make up to act out adventures on their pages, and cast a spell on their readers and classmates. Students will share their book-works with each other as we go along, and invite families and friends to share and celebrate their bewitching creations during the last week of Summer School.

Introduction to Chess We introduce chess to students in a fun and exciting way! For all students and all levels, we teach students to play chess and help them succeed in school by stimulating their problem-solving skills, analytical skills, and critical thinking. The class includes exclusive booklets and worksheets to help students. Win certificates, medals, and trophies!

Karate 4 Kids Karate classes are designed with young children in mind, providing a dynamic and active learning environment. This program has been tailored to develop children's motor skills, balance, coordination, and focus. These lessons are open to beginning, intermediate, or advanced music students. You will work with an experienced professional to learn hand position, coordination, music theory, and rhythm. Take your level of drum playing to an exciting new level. By the end of the summer, you will play the beats in pop, rock and jazz styles. You will also be able to play a solo piece in the final recital. Note: these lessons will be taught on an **electronic drum set** which are played exactly like acoustic drums but are quieter and offer built-in music (to play along to) and other exciting features.
